John 11:38-44 (NRSV)

³⁸ Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. ³⁹ Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days." ⁴⁰ Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" ⁴¹ So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upward and said, "Father, I thank you for having heard me. ⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." ⁴³ When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" ⁴⁴ The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

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Congregational Litany

One: God is not a God of confusion and disorder. God is a God of peace (I Cor. 14:33)

One: God makes all things new, and is always good.

All: God of creation and new life,

guide us when we are in transition. Help us to focus on your new way for us.

Help us to focus on you, and release the gift of the past.

One: God of creation, let your light shine on us so that we may know and celebrate that you have formed and created us in life-giving and life-receiving oneness and harmony.

All: Source of our being,

hear our prayer and bless us
with your gift of re-creation
from little deaths to letting go and rediscovering life.

One: God of grace, grant us the gift of inward joy and serenity that comes from being in relationship with you and your new-life story.

All: God of new life, bless us with your gift of grace.

One: God of love, fill our hearts with light, grace and hope that cast out the spirits of fear, anxiety and confusion. Inspire in each of us a spirit of connection, compassion, and love.

All: God of our endings, of middle spaces and new beginnings,

Our trust and hope is in you.

As we leave familiar paths, encounter barriers and forks in the road,

We know that you guide us,

Today and in all the days to come.
