# Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) & Community Farm Markets Waterloo Region

#### Introduction to CSAs:

Here is almost everything you want to know about Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) programs. CSAs are usually a Vegetable Share each week from mid-June through October, you will receive a variety of seasonal produce. You roll the dice with the farmer as to what crops up! You will have some choice at pick-up depending on what is available at the farm.

## **Examples of seasonal produce:**

- Spring: kale, spinach, cilantro, parsley, lettuce, micro-greens, radishes, garlic scapes, etc.
- Summer: eggplant, lettuce, mustard greens, swiss chard tomatoes, cucumbers, zucchini and summer squash, beets, carrots, garlic, green onions, and a variety of herbs (cilantro, parsley, basil, thyme, sage, savory) flowers, etc.
- Fall: leeks, carrots, garlic, kale, beets, mustard greens, onions, squash, spinach, chard, & herbs
- You can buy extra bunches of Basil to make pesto in August, or extra other vegetables to freeze
  or can for winter too. Some CSAs also sell meat at the pickup locations from a different supplier.

Unfortunately, the sign-up time for the CSAs was in March. Therefore, a few of them are sold out. However, you could sign up to be on the waiting list. But in the meantime, you can join a sustainable market such as Bailey's or The Sustainable Market. They are lots of fun. They are pre-packing your order now because of Covid-19.

### Farm Markets:

- Bailey's Local Foods Pick Up Location Address: First United Church 16 William Street, West, Waterloo. Enter by the glass door on Caroline near Alexandra. Open to the public on pickup days only from 3:30 until 7 pm. You sign up and then select the foods that you want from an available list. http://www.baileyslocalfoods.com/
- The Sustainable Market pick up is at Parkminister United Church, 275 Erb Street Eat, Waterloo. They are open now and have a variety of foods available. You select what you want to order and then pick it up. https://sustainablemarket.ca/account-login/

The pre-order format is simple: The farmers harvest only what was ordered (often less than 24 hours from farm to table), and they bring it to one of their convenient market locations for pickup. No food waste. No membership fees. No GMOs. No chemicals. Just clean food.
