Bishop Glenn Kauffman, lead pastor at Capital Christian Fellowship and overseer of a cluster of seven churches in the Washington-Baltimore area, addressed the MKC General Assembly, reminding us of the heart of missions. # From Deep Waters to Deep Impact: a Gathering of Faith and Action in MK Seminary

At the MKC General Assembly, Executive Minister, Doug Klassen, brought heartfelt greetings to MKC from Mennonite Church Canada.

During his devotional, Doug drew inspiration from the biblical passage Luke 5:1-11, which recounts the calling of the first disciples. The story highlights how Simon, after an exhausting night of unsuccessful fishing, was initially hesitant to cast his nets again. Yet, at the urging of Jesus, he ventured into deep waters. To his astonishment, they caught so many fish that their boats nearly sank.

This gospel narrative serves as a powerful reminder that miracles often occur when we take bold steps of faith. It is easy to cling to the safety of the shoreline, avoiding risks stemming from frustrations or past disappointments. Far too often, we find ourselves preoccupied with minor issues, neglecting the pain and suffering of those around us. We may shy away from challenging conversations, choosing comfort over engagement.

However, Jesus calls us to leave our comfort zones and embrace the risks of deep waters for a greater purpose. Doug emphasized that although this call may seem unreasonable, it challenges us to consider whom we truly trust. Simon's reply to Jesus, "...we have fished all night and caught nothing; yet, at your word, we will let down our nets for a catch," exemplifies the trust we are called to embody. By prioritizing faith in Christ over our own understanding, we open ourselves to transformation.

As we conclude this season, let us take time to reflect on where we have been "fishing" without results. We are invited to place our trust in Jesus, who abundantly provides for His church. Miracles await us when we dare to venture into the deep waters of faith together.

Our seminary's commitment to academic excellence and financial stability is driving our vision for growth for July 2024 - July 2025. This comprehensive strategy focuses on enhancing the quality of theological education, supporting our dedicated students and faculty, and ensuring we meet rigorous accreditation standards. The plan calls for the following initiatives:

#### **Enhancing Academic Excellence Through**

- refining our curriculum, attracting qualified faculty, and forging partnerships that will provide our students with invaluable real world experiences and career pathways.
- Student Support: Our strategy includes robust initiatives for admissions, financial aid assistance, and smooth transitions for students entering seminary life, ensuring they are well-equipped for their journeys.
- Community Engagement: MKS is committed to strengthening our ties with regional Bible colleges and schools. We will conduct needs assessments, collaborate on curriculum development, and provide on-going faculty training.
- Campus Revitalization: Our plan includes revitalizing the campus environment, including fostering spiritual growth through devotional sessions, mentorship programs, and practical ministry experiences.

#### Financial Plan

To sustain our mission, MKS projects an income of ETB 61,448,350 (USD 1,078,042) through a diversified revenue model, which includes educational services, facility rentals, farming product sales, and generous donations. Our expenditures will be directed toward essential operational costs and strategic capital investments.

#### Challenges and Opportunities

We acknowledge the challenges presented by the recent devaluation of the Ethiopian birr, which has led to rising inflation and increased operational costs. Nevertheless, MKS remains steadfast in its commitment to identifying innovative solutions to mitigate these impacts.

#### Fundraising and Future Vision

To solidify our financial foundation, MKS recognizes the critical importance of securing ongoing funding through donations, generating local income, and establishing strategic partnerships with churches and businesses. We aspire to develop mixed-use buildings that can further support our initiatives and strengthen our community ties.

# Demolition of Front Fence: An Unforeseen Challenge

As we reflect on the spirit of community that defines our beloved seminary, we find ourselves at a pivotal moment—one that carries both challenges and opportunities. With a heavy heart, we reach out to you to share the significant alteration our cherished campus is undergoing.

On July 03, 2024, we received an unexpected order from the governing authority that requires us to establish a mandatory setback of 2.5 meters from the front of our property. This means we must part with approximately 625 square meters of our campus—a place that has been a sanctuary of learning, faith, and communal growth.

This change brings unforeseen costs and challenges. We have had to dismantle essential components of our campus, including the front fence, security house, and parking shades. While we have quickly erected temporary barriers to keep our students and staff safe, we now face the daunting task of rebuilding these structures in a way that meets the newly imposed municipal government regulations. This necessary re-construction represents a financial burden of \$61,321that we cannot shoulder alone.

Picture them studying in the shadow of an unfinished fence; their sense of security, belonging, and focus disrupted. Imagine our devoted faculty, who pour their hearts into nurturing and guiding these students, navi-

gating a space that feels compromised and incomplete. This is the reality we are facing—a challenge that we cannot overcome without your compassionate support.

Every contribution, regardless of size, plays a vital role in our mission. Your generosity will help us rebuild not just a fence, but the safety and integrity of our community. Together, we can ensure that our campus remains a welcoming, secure environment where future leaders, scholars, and servants can flourish
